
ENGLISH CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION

POSTER MAKING COMPETITION


Poster Making Competition on COVID- 19 was conducted online on **23 April 2021** for classes III to V.


ENGLISH SPEECH COMPETITION


STORY TELLING COMPETITION




English Solo Dance competition

Diwali Celebration


Diwali is the festival of lights which is celebrated in various regions across India.

Children were dressed up in ethnic wear. Various programmes like Diwali speech, songs, traditional dance was done by the students. They also made Diwali cards .









Talent Show-2021-22




